that no part of the land applied for is within an area
of 160 acres surrounding any hot spring or spring the waters of which
possess curative or medicinal properties;

that my post-office address is Takotna, Alaska;
that this application is honestly and in good faith made for the purpose of
actual settlement and cultivation, and not for the benefit of any other per-
son, persons, or corporation; that I will faithfully and honestly endeavor to
comply with all the requirements of law as to settlement, residence, and
cultivation necessary to acquire title to the land applied for; that I am not
acting as agent of any person, corporation, or syndicate in making this entry,
nor in collusion with any person, corporation, or syndicate to give them the
benefit of the land entered, or any part thereof, or the timber thereon; that
I do not apply to enter the same for the purpose of speculation, but in good
faith to obtain a home for myself, and that I have not directly or indirectly
made, and will not make, any agreement or contract, in any way or manner, with
any person or persons, corporation, or syndicate whatsoever, by which the title
which I may acquire from the Government of the United States will inure in
whole or in part to the benefit of any person except myself. I further swear
that since August 30, 1890, I have not entered and acquired title to, nor am
I now claiming, under an entry made under any of the nonmineral public-land
laws, an amount of land which, together with the land now applied for, will
exceed in the aggregate 320 acres; and that I have not heretofore made any
entry under the homestead laws, or filed a soldier's or sailor's declaratory
statement, except

READ AND OBSERVE CAREFULLY.

CITIZENSHIP.—If native born, so state. If naturalized, so state and file record evidence; if neither, file certified copy of declara-
tion of intention, not more than seven years old. If claim is made by virtue of naturalization of father, file evidence of his naturaliza-
tion and that applicant resided in United States thereafter while a minor; if through husband, file record evidence of his naturaliza-
tion. A woman whose husband is living must show that she married before March 2, 1907, or that he is a citizen, or has declared
his intention.

MARRIED WOMAN.—Must show she is actually deserted by her husband, stating duration of desertion, and whether husband has
since helped support her; also that she is over 21 years of age; or that through mental or physical incapacitation of her husband she
is the actual head of the family.

AGE.—Each applicant, even a widow, must state that he or she is 21 years of age or over; or that he or she is the head of the
family, reciting facts in support of this statement.
